### RECTOR'S CORNER

Lent is the 40 days of the year leading up to Easter. Our participation in the Church's worship and ministry during Lent is to prepare ourselves through prayer, penitence, almsgiving and self-denial for the Death and Resurrection of Jesus. These forty days represent the time that Jesus spent in the desert before the beginning of his public ministry.

We actually begin our preparation on Shrove Tuesday, March 8 at 6 p.m. by burning the palm branches of the previous year to provide the ashes for the next day's service of Ash Wednesday. At the burning of the palms we read An Exhortation from the Book of Common Prayer page 316-317 as an opening statement of our own need for renewal. The celebration of Shrove Tuesday takes place by enjoying a supper of pancakes and rich food with a candy-filled donkey at the end of the evening.

Following the celebration of Shrove Tuesday and our goodbyes to joyous "alleluias," the Ash Wednesday service calls us to "self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; by reading and meditating on God's holy Word," and the imposition of ashes. Lizabeth Smith will be our preacher and Stuart Smith our celebrant for this special service at 7:30 p.m. on March 9.

There will be a meditation station for daily prayer set up in the corner of the church. Votive candles as signs of our continued

prayers and a special lenten cross for self-examination and renewal will be present at the station.

Two lenten studies are designed to extend the breadth of our love for persons different from ourselves. "The People of God: Unity in the Midst of Diversity" will be offered each Wednesday at 10 a.m. in the parish house of Hebron Lutheran Church. A study of Islam through the book, Approaching the Quoran will be offered Sunday evenings at 6:30 p.m. beginning March 13 at the Madison Presbyterian Church.

People who want a more hands on lenten experience may choose to help in the thrift shop at Madison Emergency Services Association (M.E.S.A.) especially during the month of April when Piedmont Church is the scheduled volunteer church. Morning and afternoon shifts are available each Tuesday, Thursday, Friday, and one Saturday during the month. A sign-up sheet will be available after Sunday services in March.

Kaaren Ray will be offering a special lenten Quiet Day on Saturday, April 2 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. This will be five hours of quiet meditation with some helps and guidance from Kaaren, and a silent lunch at noon. Please think of friends who might enjoy this unique and healing experience and invite them to come.

I give thanks for the many people who will be helping us make this a blessed time of preparation for the celebration of our Lord Jesus. With thanksgiving, Brad

## The Diocese of Virginia

February 24, 2011

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ:

On behalf of Bishop Johnston who is in Tanzania to strengthen our ties with our mission partners there, we write to you regarding the situation in the Diocese of Christchurch, New Zealand following the February 22 earthquake. The reports of loss of life and damage in Christchurch continue to mount. As of this writing, there are nearly 100 confirmed dead and over 200 people still missing. In perhaps the most powerful symbol to us as Anglicans, the steeple of Christ Church Cathedral fell, the remaining structure was severely damaged, and as many as 20 people are feared trapped inside the rubble.

The Rt. Rev. Victoria Matthews, bishop of Christchurch, has shared that there are high levels of anxiety and a sense of despair in the diocese she now serves. She noted that the current needs are as basic as finding a church with running water that is structurally safe and can serve as a spiritual base to meet the profound needs of those in the diocese. She also is calling on her clergy to "go out into the highways and byways to offer pastoral care." (Many of you will remember Bishop Matthews' powerful presence amongst us as the chaplain of the 213<sup>th</sup> Annual Council of the Diocese of Virginia in 2008.)

From across the world, we as sisters and brothers of Christchurch can lend a helping hand. Episcopal Relief and Development, or "ERD", is an incredibly effective organization that is well practiced in disaster relief. We have worked closely with them in Sudan, in Haiti, and in countless other areas of need. Should you wish to donate to them, you can do so directly on their website at [www.er-d.org](http://www.er-d.org). In addition, you can also donate through the Diocese of Virginia either online or by check payable to the Diocese with "New Zealand Relief" in the memo line. We will bundle those donations and get them to the Diocese of Christchurch as soon as possible.

In addition, we hope you will pray this collect in your parishes and homes this week:

*God of mercy, comfort those who are grieving, give peace to those who have died and protect those who are working to save lives. Strengthen the Christchurch community for the long period of recovery and healing ahead. Help us to support them through prayer and compassion. Amen.*

## JAMES AND DOLLEY MADISON AND THE FOUNDING OF OUR NATION

The center for the Constitution at James Madison's Montpelier is offering a new spring seminar to all members of the general public. It will focus on the lives of James and Dolley Madison and their enormous contributions to the founding of our nation. The seminar will meet every Wednesday from March 30 until April 27,

from 4:00 to 5:30 p.m. Classes will be held in Lewis Hall, the Center's teaching facilities on the grounds of Montpelier.

Jim Walker, a senior guide at Montpelier and regular instructor in various adult education programs, will teach the core of the seminar. The content of the seminar will include:

- The founding of our nation;
- Who the founders were and what roles they played;
- The role of slavery in the founding;
- The tumultuous years following the Declaration of Independence;
- The Constitution and the ratification debates;
- Madison's executive years as Secretary of State and President;
- The Madisons' retirement years at Montpelier;
- And the legacy they have left to us.

The program will also include private tours of the house and grounds of Montpelier led by Montpelier's professional staff. Marsha Nitzburg will lead a tour of James Madison's home, which recently underwent a \$24-million architectural restoration. Mark Tricket, Ph.D., Field Director of Archaeology at Montpelier, will lead a tour and discussion of the archaeological research that continues to shape our understanding of the Montpelier plantation. The house tour will be conducted after regular visitation hours; the archaeological tour has been

created especially for this course and is not offered outside of this course.

Participants will also receive a special copy of the U.S. Constitution and a copy of An Introduction to Archaeology at James Madison's Montpelier, an in-depth guide to understanding the archaeological research being conducted at James Madison's Montpelier.

The cost of the course is \$50 per person. Tuition includes the cost of both tours. If you have questions, please call Andy Washburn at (540) 672-2728 ext. 201.
